Infrastructure is the network of public works systems and facilities that serves as the backbone of our country's physical plants. It includes public buildings (schools, medical and government facilities, etc.), the street network, public transit systems, power facilities, water and wastewater systems, highways, airports, ports, railroads, etc.

The quality of a nation's infrastructure is a critical index of its economic vitality and visibility. Reliable transportation, clean water and the safe disposal of wastes are basic elements of civilized society and a productive economy. The absence of failure of these elements places an unacceptable burden on our citizens and is a major obstacle to growth, competitiveness and a high quality of life.

While a sound infrastructure does not guarantee

future prosperity, long-term economic growth cannot be achieved without it. In addition, infrastructure investment directly supports additional economic activity.

We believe that infrastructure investment must be an absolute priority for our governments. Our countries must ensure that our highways and subways move us swiftly and safely; that our homes, farms and industries are supplied with ample of clean water; that we reduce and safely dispose of the increasing volume of waste generated by our societies; that our educational and other public buildings are adequate to meet their purposes and that we provide the structural underpinning for a robust and competitive economy.

Most government expenditures attempt to meet current obligations and the benefits therefrom

do not extend beyond the current fiscal year. In addition, not all sectors of the economy benefit from government expenditures. In contrast, prudent investment by a nation in its infrastructure provides benefits to both current and future generations and all economic sectors.

Governments have an obligation to enhance and preserve public infrastructure for current and future generations. Governments must therefore have a long-term plan for infrastructure maintenance and upgrading. Financing is a critical element of such plan. This plan should, where necessary, provide for private sector financing in addition to public investment.

Infrastructure investment leads economic development and prosperity. Unfortunately,

in harsh fiscal times infrastructure investment is often the first expenditure targeted for budget cuts. Such action jeopardizes the quality of life of future generations, the quality of the environment, and the future prosperity of the country. A wise time to invest in a country's infrastructure is when the economy may be depressed. Prosperous countries became so by investing in their future when they were not prosperous.

Therefore, we call upon the political leadership of the Americas to take all necessary actions to provide adequate and timely investment in the infrastructure of our respective countries in order to build economic, social and environmental quality of life for all citizens.




